****Novice Stock Horse Pleasure Class Rule:** To be eligible to ride in this class the rider must not have received a first place Year-End Award in Novice, or a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place award in any Western Pleasure class in any association for the past 3 years. Points go strictly to the rider. This is enforced by the "HONOR SYSTEM". This rule must be printed on the show bill.

It is **Mandatory** in all classes (*except: Hunt Seat and Timed events*) to wear **Appropriate Western Attire, including long sleeves reaching the wrist and western hat**. In all speed events hat and long sleeves are optional. Safety helmets shall be deemed appropriate attire.

Negative coggins required at registration.
