Horse show open to all registered Western Stock horses (AQHA, APHA, ApHC, IBHA, etc.)

Show your horse for National All Age-Amateur-Youth points. Earn ROM's, Superiors & other National titles.

Join ARHA, register & show your horse the same day (must have front and back copies of Breed Registry papers.)

FEES AND CHARGES

MoRHA Member Fees: All Ages \$10 per class; Amateur \$10 per class; Youth \$5 per class.

Show All Day: All Ages & Amateur \$60; Youth \$25

All Day Horse: (any combination of all 3 divisions) \$75

Cattle Charge: \$20 per exhibitor per class

Office Fee: \$10 per horse

Stalls: \$20 (no tie-outs, all horses must be stalled)

Non-Member Fees: All Ages \$10 per class; Amateur \$10 per class; Youth \$5 per class

Cattle Charge: \$25 per exhibitor per class

Office Fee: \$10 per horse

Stalls: \$20 (no tie-outs, all horses must be stalled)

ARHA Ranch Horse Versatility Fee: \$100 plus regular show fees. 50% Payback at each show. 50% Payback by ARHA at year end.

Classes Include: Versatility Conformation, Versatility Ranch Riding, Ranch Trail, Ranch Cutting, and Working Ranch Horse.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All exhibitors are requested to thoroughly acquaint themselves with the rules of the Missouri State Fair and their respective breed association rules, as well as the Missouri Department of Agriculture - Veterinary Division.
- No fake tails, banded manes or hoof polish. No gimmicks to distract from the horse's natural appearance or movement.
- Exhibitors and herd help must show in western shirt, hat/helmet, boots and jeans. Working tack only for horses.
- Gate Admission Fee: Adult - \$8 per day, Child (12 & under) - Free, (*Adult Admission for August 20 is \$2)
- Parking: \$5 per day. All exhibitors must purchase a parking pass, and must be displayed in vehicle. (All untagged vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.)
- RV Hookups: Complete the camping form on our website.
- At the end of the show, all exhibitors must have a release signed by the MoRHA Show Secretary in order to leave the fairgrounds. This form will indicate the number of horses released to the person listed, and be checked by the gate staff upon exit.
- Exhibitors may bring in feed, forage, and bedding for their use (not for sale) during the Show. Space in the barns is for livestock exhibit purposes and may not be used for storage of feed or bedding. Feed and bedding will be available on the Fairgrounds.
- All horses' registered name and ARHA number, as well as owners' and exhibitors' ARHA numbers must be legibly printed on entry forms. Entries will not be accepted without this information. Current ARHA membership card must be presented at time of entry. Please include owner and exhibitor address on entries also.
- MoRHA, ARHA, and Missouri State Fair are NOT responsible for accidents or injuries to horses, exhibitors or spectators. Missouri Equine Liability statute in effect.
- PARKING RULES FOR SHOW:** No horse trailers or trucks may be left in front or back of barns or around tents per directive of the State Fire Marshall. Horse trailers must be parked in designated trailer parking areas **ONLY**. Vehicles parked in prohibited areas will be subject to tow.
- Proof of a current negative Coggins Test will be mandatory for ALL horses entering the Missouri State Fairgrounds. The state veterinarian may request proof and it must be provided. All horse trailers must enter gate 4.
- Consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited while showing.

MoRHA classes do not accrue ARHA points. They are open to all horses, ARHA registered or not. **MoRHA classes do not accrue points for club High Point awards.

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ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION

1. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS EQUINE.

A. Intrastate (equine in Missouri moving for exhibition only).

- Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be

- excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.
2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is not required.
 3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or micro chip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
- B. Interstate (equine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
1. Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.
 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
 3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or micro chip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
 4. Alteration or substitution of any information on any VS Form 10-11 including certified photocopy or certified facsimile or any official copy of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall cause the document to be invalid and in violation of sections 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may result in civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per violation and subject to expulsion.
5. A six (6) - month passport from states with which there is a reciprocal agreement will be accepted in lieu of VS Form 10-11. These passports must have proof of a negative EIA test within thirty (30) days of the date of application of the passport and permanent identification for each horse by means of registered brand, legible tattoo, or microchip to be recorded on the passport and the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart, along with other identifying characteristics. In the event of confirmed vesicular stomatitis in any of the states with which reciprocal agreements exist, use of the six (6) - month passport will be suspended by the state veterinarian of Missouri.
 6. Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis (VEE) vaccination and entry permit is required prior to entry on equine originating from states in which VEE has been diagnosed within the preceding twelve (12) months.
 7. Any equine originating from a premise under quarantine for Vesicular Stomatitis shall obtain an entry permit and must include the statement on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that "the equine listed have not been exposed to Vesicular Stomatitis or located within (10) miles of premises quarantined for Vesicular Stomatitis within the past thirty (30) days".
- C. The board, organization or manager of each assembly or event is responsible for certifying that all equine admitted or participating meet the regulations in this section and shall not admit or allow participation of equine not so certified. Untested equine shall not be allowed to congregate with other equine. The owner of each animal shall comply with requirements under this section 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may be assessed civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each violation.
